The Declaration of Identity Form **MUST** be completed by one of the following individuals who will in this document be called the Declarant:

<b>For a Minor:</b>	<b>For an Adult</b> (Elderly or Physically incapacitated):
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mother</li> <li>• Father (if his name is on your Birth Certificate)</li> <li>• Older Sibling</li> <li>• Grandparent</li> <li>• Legal Guardian</li> </ul> <p><b>Note</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– The Declaration of Identity Form for minors <b>MUST</b> be duly completed and signed by the Declarant and notarized by a Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, or Attorney-at-Law. The signature of the Declarant should match the signature on their valid identification card.</li> <li>– Where a Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, or Attorney-at-Law is the Declarant, this form <b>MUST</b> be notarized by another person having any of these credentials.</li> <li>– This Declaration of Identity Form will expire in 10 years.</li> </ul>

The following documents **MUST** be submitted along with the Declaration of Identity Form:

- Notarized passport size photograph of the person being identified. (photograph must be no more than three (3) months old)
- Original or notarized copy of Birth Certificate/Adoption Certificate or Court Order of the person being identified.
- Declarant’s Valid Form of Identification.
- Declarant’s Proof of relationship, (e.g. Birth Certificate, Adoption Certificate or Court Order).  
*Proof is not required if the Declarant is a Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, or Attorney at Law*
