The Declaration of Identity Form MUST be completed by one of the following individuals who will in this document be called the Declarant:

The signature of the Declarant should match the signature on their valid identification card. This Declaration of Identity Form will expire on the client's 18th birthday. This Declaration of Identity Form will expire in 10 years. 			

The following documents MUST be submitted along with the Declaration of Identity Form:

- Notarized passport size photograph of the person being identified. (photograph must be no more than three (3) months old)
- Original or notarized copy of Birth Certificate/Adoption Certificate or Court Order of the person being identified.
- Declarant's Valid Form of Identification.
- Declarant's Proof of relationship, (e.g. Birth Certificate, Adoption Certificate or Court Order). *Proof is not required if the Declarant is a Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, or Attorney at Law*
